# Community Development Partnership Celebrates Community at Annual Farm Fundraiser

**Eastham, MA** – The Community Development Partnership (CDP) is celebrating at their 5<sup>th</sup> Annual *Summer Evening on the Farm.* You're invited to join them as they honor their past and look ahead to the future. The event will take place on Wednesday, August 22<sup>nd</sup> from 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM at Halcyon Farm in Brewster. The event at the farm will be followed by *A Farm to Table Feast* at Sunbird Kitchen in Orleans later that evening.

Guests can continue the evening with an intimate farm-to-table dinner at Sunbird Kitchen in Orleans. *A Farm to Table Feast* features 3-courses prepared with fresh, locally sourced ingredients, including wine and beer pairings. Guests will learn where the food comes from and how it's prepared. Starting at 7:30 PM. Tickets for the *Farm to Table Feast* are \$200 (includes admission to Summer Evening on the Farm).
