Brewster Special Town Meeting Monday, May 5th at 6pm 384 Underpass Road

ARTICLE 6: Transfers \$600,000 in estimated Short Term Rental tax receipts to the Affordable Housing Trust through the Town budget.
ARTICLE 9: Includes \$147,849 for Community Housing, \$79,000 of which will pay the salary of Housing Coordinator on town staff.
ARTICLE 11: Continues the funding of preschool support program, approved at 2024 Annual Town Meeting, with \$250,000.
ARTICLE 16: Accepts the report of the Short-Term Rental Task Force.

THE REALITY

- The median home price in Brewster is \$699,000. The Median Household Income in Brewster is \$94,798. In order for the average resident to buy a home in Brewster, they need to make \$209,798 a year.
- 55.4% of renters and 25.7% of homeowners in Brewster spend more than 30% of their monthly income on housing costs.
- 87.1% of businesses in Brewster have fewer than 10 employees. Many of these local businesses struggle to stay open because it is difficult for employees to find housing.
- Since 2014, there has been a 9% decrease in school enrollment on the Lower and Outer Cape overall.
- 41% of homes in Brewster are seasonally empty.
