Orleans Annual Town Meeting Monday, May 12th at 6pm Nauset Middle School Gymnasium

ARTICLE 22: Allocates \$10,000 for the "Lower Cape Housing Institute" to educate officials on the creation of year-round housing.

ARTICLE 28: Clarifies that 'low- and moderate-income' will be defined as housing for the benefit of households or individuals earning up to 120% of the HUD Area Median Income.

ARTICLE 32: Provides an opportunity to address housing needs using State support with consideration for regionally unique seasonal challenges by accepting the Seasonal Communities designation.

ARTICLE 35: Fund the Assessors Department to expedite the adoption of a residential exemption.

THE REALITY

- The median home price in Orleans is \$900,000. The Median Household Income in Orleans is \$89,797. In order for the average resident to buy a home in Orleans, they need to make \$268,934 a year.
- 55% of renters and 26% of homeowners in Orleans spend more than 30% of their monthly income on housing costs.
- 10.5% of the populations in Orleans lives at or below the poverty line. This is higher than the state average.
- 84.49% of businesses in Orleans have fewer than 10 employees. Many of these local businesses struggle to stay open because it is difficult for employees to find housing.
- Since 2014, there has been a 9% decrease in school enrollment on the Lower and Outer Cape overall.
- 46% of homes in Orleans are seasonally empty.
